

Management Burns and Fuel Hazard Reductions burns may be approved through October 31<sup>st</sup>.

Recreational fires are allowed but check with your local fire protection agency for restrictions.

It is prohibited to burn the following materials at any time:

- (a) any waste moved from the premises where it was generated;
- (b) food wastes;
- (c) styrofoam and other plastics;
- (d) wastes generating noxious odors;
- (e) wood and wood by-products that have been treated, coated, painted, stained, or contaminated by a foreign material, such as papers, cardboard, or painted or stained wood;
- (f) poultry litter;
- (g) animal droppings;
- (h) dead animals or dead animal parts;
- (i) tires;
- (j) rubber materials;
- (k) asphalt shingles;
- (l) tar paper;
- (m) automobile or aircraft bodies and interiors;
- (n) insulated wire;
- (o) oil or petroleum products;
- (p) treated lumber and timbers;
- (q) pathogenic wastes;
- (r) hazardous wastes as defined by 40 CFR Part 261;
- (s) trade wastes;
- (t) any materials resulting from a salvage operation;
- (u) chemicals;
- (v) Christmas tree waste;
- (w) asbestos or asbestos-containing materials;
- (x) standing or demolished structures; and
- (y) paint.

The burning of stumps, the burning of grass clippings and leaves, and overnight smoldering of burns is prohibited.

Burning on any city or county street, road or alley is prohibited.

The use of burn barrels, or other unapproved devices, is prohibited.
